- ... which has been **hidden from** strangers for years. 替换

造句: We often read in newspapers how a seemingly respectable **personality was charged with tax evasion** which had been concealed from the public for years. 我们常常在报纸上会读到一个表面上很体面的名人 是如何因为偷税漏税而被起诉的, 而这种行为他们对公众隐瞒了很多年。

※ The English language possesses a vivid saying to describe this sort of situation.

『 **saying** proverb / adage 谚语; 格言、老话说 』

- The Chinese language possesses a vivid **saying** 'God favors the diligent'.
- As an old Chinese **saying goes**, 'God favors the diligent'.

※ The terrible secret is called 'a skeleton in the cupboard'.

『 **a skeleton in the cupboard / closet** 橱柜里的骷髅(隐情、不可外扬的家丑) 』

※ At some dramatic moment in the story, the terrible secret becomes known and a reputation is ruined.

造句：The seemingly respectable official embezzled enormous government funds. Now the secret **becomes known** and his reputation **is ruined**. 这个道貌岸然的官员贪污了巨额公款。现在这个秘密已经公开了，他也名声扫地。

❖ The reader's hair **stands on end** when he reads in the final pages of the novel that the heroine, a dear old lady who had always been so kind to everybody, **had**, in her youth, **poisoned** every one of her five husbands.

- unpack my suitcase 归置

※ I **opened** the cupboard door and then **stood** in front of it petrified.

- She came home **sick**.
