『 **practice** n. 习俗, 惯例, 习惯性的做法 』

- On the other hand, your stomach would turn at the idea of frying potatoes in animal fat—the normally accepted **practice** in many northern countries.
- It takes a lot of **practice** to play the violin well. 拉好小提琴需要多加练习。
- In **practice**, however, such an attitude is counterproductive. 然而在实际中, 这种态度会适得其反。
- Skill comes with **practice**. 熟能生巧。
- This was a **practice** sanctified by tradition. 这是一种合乎传统的做法。
- This **practice** is frowned upon as being wasteful. 这种做法被认为是浪费而不被赞成。

- Sheila will inherit everything **in the event of** his death. 他一旦故去，所有财产都由希拉继承。
- Even **in the event of** a fire, fewer trees are consumed. 即使发生火灾，损失的树木也会更少。
- You can call me **in the event of** an emergency you can't handle. 万一有你不能处理的紧急情况，你可以打电话给我。

- The pie committee decided that the best way to transport the dish would be by canal, **so** they **insured** it for the trip.
- In the new country he became absorbed in making a new life for the two of us, **so that** he **gradually ceased** to grieve.
- This time they fixed heavy metal clamps to both sides of the dish **so that** they **could fasten** the chains.
- This time he was barking **so that** someone **would let him out!**
- The one with the money got **such** a fright **that** he **dropped** the bag.
- The ball struck him **so hard that** he nearly **fell** into the water.

『 **bake** v. to cook food in an oven without extra fat or liquid 烘焙 』

- During a radio programme, a company of biscuit manufacturers once asked listeners to **bake** biscuits and send them to their factory.

『 **fair** n. a large public event where goods are bought and sold, usually from tables which have been specially arranged for the event, and where there is often entertainment 大型集市, 庙会 』

- At a village **fair**, I decided to visit a fortune-teller called Madam Bellinsky.
- I wanted them to get a **fair** deal. 我希望他们得到一个公平的交易。
- Every autumn I go to the county **fair**. 每个秋季我都去县里的集市。

※ The pie committee **decided** that the best way to transport the dish **would be by canal**, **so** they **insured** it for the trip.

『 **decide** 不一定译为“决定” 』

- From then on, Harry **decided** that this little game he had invented might prove to be expensive.
- I **decided** that I must have taken a wrong turning somewhere.

※ Shortly **after** it **was launched**, the pie committee **went** to a local inn to celebrate.

『 **shortly before / after ...** 不久之前/之后... 』

- The accident happened **shortly before** midday. 介词
- I saw him **shortly before** he died. 连词
- Police arrived at the scene **shortly after** midnight.

『 **launch** v. to put a boat or ship into the water 使船下水 』

- The lifeboat **was launched** immediately to rescue the four men.

『 **inn** n. a small hotel or pub, especially an old one in the countryside (乡下的) 酒馆, 客栈 』

- I always feel at home at **Ye Olde Starre Inn**. 在昨日星辰客栈, 我总是觉得非常舒适安逸。
- I learnt that the house had formerly been **an inn**. 我得知这座房子以前是家客栈。
- She washed her face at the pump in front of **the inn**. 她在客栈前的水泵旁洗了洗脸。
- **The inn** gift shop stocks quality Indian crafts and sundries. 这个小旅馆的礼品店备有优质的印度工艺品和其他杂品。

※ **At the same time, a number of teenagers climbed on to the dish and held a little party of their own.**

『 **hold** v. 拿住、担任、举行... 』

- The Olympic Games will be **held** in our country in four years' time.
- Once a year, a race is **held** for old cars.
- A Festival for the Dead is **held** once a year in Japan.

- A match was **held** at Stilton, where both men fought for an hour.

※ **Dancing proved to be more than the dish could bear, for during the party it capsized and sank in seven feet of water.**

『 **be more than ... can / could...** 是...不能/无法... 』

- When my old friend Brian urged me to accept a cigarette, it **was more than I could bear**.
- In the end, it **was more than he could bear**.
- This **was more than we could bear**, so we decided to spend our last day exploring the countryside.
- The pain **is more than I can bear**.
- The story **is more than I can believe**.
- The beauty of the West Lake **is more than words can describe**.
- The weather turned out to be very good, which **was more than we could expect**.

『 **capsize** vt.倾覆（特指船）；翻覆；弄翻 vi.翻；倾覆；翻覆 』

- We were afraid (that) we were going to **capsize** the boat. 我们担心会把船弄翻。

『 **shiver / tremble** 颤抖 』

- We were **trembling** with excitement. 人做主语
- The bridge **trembled** as the train sped across it. 物做主语
- Suddenly, there was a slight **trembling** sound from below, and the captain went down to see what had happened.
- By this time her legs were beginning to **tremble**, so she sat down and accepted a cup of very strong tea, while he telephoned the police.

『 **look on** 旁观、看热闹 』

- The gaoler **looked on** eagerly, anxious to see if his fellow-actor had at last learnt his lines.
- Even the bull seemed to feel sorry for him, for it **looked on** sympathetically until the drunk was out of the way before once more turning its attention to the matador.
- We **look on** her as a daughter. vt. 看着是

『 **locate** v. 定位、确定位置 』

- They **located** the right chimney by tapping at the walls and listening for the man's cries.
- He described it as 'a very agreeable situation **located** within two small hills in the midst of which flowed a great river'. 位于

※ They had little difficulty in finding it, but hauling it out of the water proved to be a serious problem.

『 **have difficulty (in) doing sth.** 做某事很困难 』

- She **has difficulty in understanding** complex mathematical concepts. 她理解复杂的数学概念有困难。

<b>have trouble (in) doing sth.</b> 做某事有困难	He has trouble finding his keys every morning. 他每天早上都找不到他的钥匙。

※ The sides of the dish were so smooth that it was almost impossible to attach hawsers and chains to the rim without damaging it.

『 **hawser** n. (船上的) 粗缆绳 』

- The **hawser** can either be thick, heavy ropes. 缆绳既可以指粗重的绳子。

※ Eventually chains were fixed to one end of the dish and a powerful winch was put into operation.

- The platoon tried to use a **winch** and a hook to pull the truck back onto the road, but it was too heavy. 部队试图用绞车和钩子把卡车拽回到路上，但它太重了。
- He would attach a cable around the chassis of the car and **winch** it up on to the canal bank. 他会在汽车底盘上拴一条缆绳，然后用绞车把汽车吊到运河岸边。

『 **put / bring sth. into operation** to make sth start working. 开动、实施, 使生效 』

- It's time to **put our plan into operation**.
- New legislation will **be brought into operation** in January.

※ The dish **rose** to the surface and **was** gently **drawn** towards the canal bank.

『 **gently** adv. carefully, without a lot of force or sudden change in movement 小心翼翼地 』

- Frank **gently** lifted the crockery out of the box and suddenly noticed a miniature painting at the bottom of the packing case.
- Before long, the noise dropped completely, and the boat began to drift **gently** across the water.
- We **gently** woke him up and asked him to ferry us to the other side.

※ For one agonizing moment, the dish **was perched** precariously on the bank of the canal, but it suddenly **overbalanced** and **slid** back into the water.

『 **perch** v.坐落于.....的上方（或边缘） 』

- He watched the game from his precarious **perch** on top of the wall. 他无视安全，高坐在墙头上观看比赛。
- He'll perch on the edge of his seat to get closer. 他会坐在他位子的边缘，只为与你靠的更近。

be perched on ... 栖 息在...	The path led to a tiny village (which was) <b>perched on</b> the steep sides of a mountain.
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『 **precarious** adj.摇摇欲坠的，不稳固的；（局势）不确定的，危险的 』

- a precarious future 前途未卜
- He is in **precarious** health.

**precariously** adv. 不稳定地

They lived **precariously** on the income from a few small investments.

『 **overbalance** v. 失去平衡 』

- He overbalanced and fell head first. 他失去了平衡而且头部先着了地。

※ The men **were** now **obliged** to try **once more**.

『 **be / feel obliged to do sth.** (由于责任、道义) 不得不做某事 』

- However, as the evidence began to accumulate, experts from the Zoo **felt obliged to investigate**, ...
- He had **been obliged to** join the army during the Second World War.

※ **This time they fixed heavy metal clamps to both sides of the dish so that they could fasten the chains.**

『 **clamp** n. device for holding things tightly together, usu by means of a screw 夹具、夹钳 』

- The wood is held in position by a **clamp**. 这木头用夹钳固定住了。
- My old artificial hand had a pretty basic open-close mechanism similar to a **clamp**. 我的旧假手有一个非常基本的开关装置，类似于夹钳。
- Blades without clips are held by screws and the **clamp** on the handle. 失去金属夹的刀片由螺丝和手柄上的夹子固定。

※ The dish now **had to be lifted** vertically **because** one edge **was resting against the side of the canal.**

『 **rest (sth.) on / against sth.** 把(某物)搁在[靠在]某物上 』

- She stood three feet high and her hands **rested on** her hips.

※ The winch **was** again **put into operation** and one of the men **started up the truck.**

『 **start (sth. ↔) up** 启动(汽车、马达) if an engine, car etc. starts up, or you start it up, it begins working 』

- The driver got back into the car and **started up**.
- Rory **started up** the engine and got the vehicle moving.

※ Several minutes later, the dish was successfully hauled above the surface of the water.

『haul v. (用力) 拖, 拉』

- A crane had to be used to **haul** the car out of the stream. 不得不用了一台起重机把轿车从河里拉出来。
- They grab Jake and **haul** him to his feet. 他们抓住杰克, 把他拖到跟前。
- Rickshaws are not there to **haul** around tourists. 人力车不是用来拉游客的。

※ Water **streamed** in torrents over its sides with such force that it set up a huge wave in the canal.

『torrent n. 洪流』

- The trickle became a stream; the stream has now become a torrent.
- The field trip involved crossing a raging **torrent**. 越野旅行包括跨越一条汹涌的急流。
- After the winter rains, the stream becomes a raging **torrent**. 冬雨过后, 溪流湍急。

- Tazieff was able to **set up** his camp very close to the volcano while it was erupting violently. 搭建

※ There **was** a danger **that** the wave **would rebound** off the other side of the bank and **send** the dish **plunging into the water** again.

『 there is / was a danger that ... 有...一个危险 』

- This greatly reduced the speed of the ship, for **there was a danger that** if she travelled too quickly, this rudder would be torn away as well.
